Dear Very Reverend Frs. Tim Nondorf and Fredy Calvario,

I am writing on behalf of a small ad hoc committee of Finance Council members and parishioners at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church in Carmel Valley. The committee was commissioned in October this year to look into facts surrounding the acquisition and installation of

- a new back altar for the tabernacle,
- several pieces of artwork,
- colorization of existing statues, and
- new altar furnishings.

The committee is also to report to the priest, the Finance Council, and to the parish at large its conclusions and recommendations for how such acquisitions and installations should happen in the future.

We will be concluding our work in the coming weeks.

Unfortunately, we still have not received any guidance from the Diocese on what it considers extraordinary vs ordinary administration in matters such as this work (requested 21 October), which makes it more difficult for us to ensure our recommendations for future work will be consistent with Diocese guidelines. Your input would make for a much stronger report for the parish we serve.

If you prefer, the committee would very much like an opportunity to meet with either or both of you, at your convenience of course.

## Notes from Interview of Fr Jhonnatan

December 4, 2025, 1:00 PM

Attended by Rebecca Bayless, John Finn, Alex Gray, and James Rice

### Motivation

- The church was too plain and, especially the crucifix was too small

### Crucifix

- artisan from Ibarra, Ecuador, recommended by uncle
- Fr J met with artisan before Tom Albanese approached FrJ
- it's a replica of the one in the rectory
- the artisan used a photo of the old crucifix as a model
- shipped with FrJ end of January 2025
- bill of sale? FrJ says he has it, will send
- back altar idea came later
- FrJ knows nothing about where the old crucifix came from, its history

### Back Altar

- Sergio Barajas (SB) made drawings attached to his invoices
  - there are other drawings that FrJ has
- Fr. Lucas / San Miguel recommended Barajas
- TSS Millworks also worked on a design
  - got too expensive
- FrJ has a written estimate, drawings from TSS Millworks
- SB took measurements personally
- SB installed the altar
- SB has done many jobs for the Fresno Diocese
- Style: "stars on blue" – FrJ
- 3 payments each <\$20,000 to avoid diocese
- no sales tax charged
- Fr J doesn't know anything about SB's business
- There is no breakdown on material vs price

### Paintings and Frames

- needed to fill space left by moving statues
- Our Lady of Guadalupe is a replica from Mexico
  - The size of print drove the size of the other paintings
- Salvador Zárata did Sacred Heart painting
  - model taken from internet
- old Our Lady of Guadalupe painting donated by Lucy Zarazua's mother

- Lucy Zarazua ok with moving it
- now in closet in the church
- Fr J went to Poland, visited site associated with St Faustina, St Faustina was not happy with original and FrJ chose this version
- An **anonymous donor** donated funds for the Divine Mercy because he wanted it, \$5,000
- no consultation with anyone else
  
- SB proposed frames, he had material in stock

**Our Lady of Guadalupe** – \$2,500 (frame only)

**Sacred Heart** – \$2,000

**Divine Mercy** – \$3,500 (included painting)

- Sacred Heart painting was \$300
- SB had frame in stock

### **Painted Statues**

- Fr J doesn't know the history of the statues, where they came from, what they're made of, how old they are
- no complaints from parishioners; FrJ just thought they were pale
- Sergio Barajas's brother hauled them for colorization [to Arvin presumably]
  - we don't know how they were handled

### **Furniture**

- ambo, book holder, lectern, candle holders
- \$6000

### **Risen Lord**

- Needed to fill empty space after tabernacle moved
- this will be hung over altar in Easter
- this is an Ibarra Ecuador replica of something FrJ found
- sponsored by Cachagua
- no bill of sale yet — need to get receipt
- FJ thinks it cost about \$1,200–\$1,500

### **Consultation**

- started with baptismal font, which was also made by the Ibarra artisan
- Fr J not aware of church rules other than regarding moving the tabernacle
- the priest has authority to make all changes without consulting anyone

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## NEW BACK ALTAR

*Moses then wrote down all the words of the Lord and, rising early in the morning, he built at the foot of the mountain an altar and twelve sacred stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. (Exodus 24:4)*



*Entonces escribió Moisés todas las palabras de Yahveh; y, levantándose de mañana, alzó al pie del monte un altar y doce estelas por las doce tribus de Israel. (Exodo 24,4)*

An altar serves as a sacred space where we meet with God, offering our prayers, love, and sacrifices. In ancient times, the Israelites used altars to express their faith and devotion, showcasing the importance of worship in their lives.



This Back Altar has been blessed by Most Rev. Daniel E. Garcia, Bishop of Monterey, on July 13<sup>th</sup> 2025. This Sunday is closer to the Feast Day of Our Lady of Mount Carmel on July 16th.

The structure of the Back Altar was made by Sergio Barajas from Sacred Art Restorations in Arvin, California. Mr. Barajas also retouched the existing images of Our Lady of Mount Carmel and St. Joseph. He also adapted our current 'ambo' with a book holder, made the candle stands and lectern to match the whole style of our sanctuary area. Maple wood material, and highlights and moldings in gold leaf for the Back Altar were used.





The New Crucifix was Carved by Fernando Raúl Castro Terán, from San Antonio de Ibarra, Ecuador. Mr. Teran is polychrome gilder and religious sculpture, who has been working in this art for 20 years. He inherited this talent from his father.

The Crucified Christ is made of naranjillo wood. Naranjillo wood refers to wood from various South American trees, often used for religious images and instruments. The cross is made of black laurel wood and a natural finish with a touch of wood stain.

La estructura del Altar Posterior fue hecha por Sergio Barajas, de Sacred Art Restorations en Arvin, California. El Sr. Barajas también retocó las imágenes existentes de Nuestra Señora del Carmen y San José. Adaptó nuestro ambón actual con un porta libro, fabricó los candelabros y el atril para que combinaran con el estilo general de nuestro presbiterio. Se utilizó madera de arce, así como detalles y molduras en pan de oro para el Altar Posterior.

El Nuevo Crucifijo fue tallado por Fernando Raúl Castro Terán, de San Antonio de Ibarra, Ecuador. El Sr. Terán es dorador, policromado y escultor religioso, y lleva 20 años trabajando en este arte. Heredó este talento de su padre.

El Cristo Crucificado está hecho de madera de naranjillo. La madera de naranjillo se refiere a la madera de varios árboles Sudamericanos, frecuentemente utilizada para imágenes religiosas e instrumentos musicales. La cruz está hecha de laurel negro y tiene un acabado natural con un toque de barniz.

# Summary of Interview of Trini Resendiz

November 16, 2025, 4:00 PM

John Finn and Alondra Valdez-Klemek

This summary was circulated among participants to confirm its accuracy.

*Las Posadas in Cachagua has an organizing committee who raises funds to support the annual novena. Fr Jhonnatan knew the committee had cash on hand, and he approached the committee to suggest they provide funds to purchase a "Risen Lord" figure and cross. The purchase was entirely Fr Jhonnatan's idea. He said he needed \$1800, and the committee put that cash into a reserve. They have not paid Fr Jhonnatan yet. Trini talked to Chulo, who is on the committee and asked why Fr Jhonnatan has not been paid. Chulo said they asked Fr Jhonnatan for the receipt for the purchase, and he has not given it to them. Fr Jhonnatan has not asked for the cost of shipping the figure to be covered (which OLMC has).*

**OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL****Finance Council Meeting  
June 4, 2025  
Minutes**

The Finance Council of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Catholic parish met on Wednesday, 6/4/25 from 3:00 to 4:00 in the parish hall meeting room. The meeting was called to order by Alex and a quorum was established.

Council members present:

- Alex Gray (Chairman)
- AB Introcaso (by telephone)
- Jack McAler
- Jim Rice (Secretary)

*Ex-officio* members present:

- Fr. Jhonnatan Carmona
- Rebecca Bayless (Bookkeeper) (by telephone)

Council member absent:

- Ed Quinnan

Fr. Jhonnatan offered an opening prayer [“Help us to better serve Our Lady of Mount Carmel and Carmel Valley. . .”]. Alex then stated that the principal purposes of the meeting were:

- (a) to review the interim financial condition and results of operations of the parish for the current fiscal year, as reflected on a balance sheet, income statement and statement of restricted funds as at and for the eight months ended 4/30/25 [copies attached] which were prepared by Rebecca;
- (b) to discuss new business items; and
- (c) to discuss certain preliminary FY 2025-2026 budget numbers.

Accordingly, Alex walked the meeting through various key line items of the aforementioned financial statements and, along with Rebecca, responded to members’ questions, comments and concerns. Such line items included:

- (i) on the balance sheet, cash on hand amounted to approximately \$223,000 of which \$102,000 is represented by restricted funds carried on the balance sheet as current liabilities;

- (ii) also on the balance sheet, the \$24,000 of restricted funds represented by the Grounds & Maintenance Fund is net of approximately \$20,000 reclassified at the last Finance Council meeting from that fund to operating funds;
- (iii) on the income statement, plate collections of \$134,000 represented a “healthy” 78% of the amount budgeted for the whole year for this item;
- (iv) on the income statement, the \$36,000 recorded for AMA rebate as of 4/30 had risen to \$64,000 as of 5/26 “and counting” which, net of the diocese’s share of \$11,000, represents a substantial surplus over the \$38,000 budgeted for this item<sup>1</sup>;
- (v) on the income statement, the amount recorded for fund raising (\$21,000) does not include any revenue from a festival or a crab dinner neither of which were held this year, and the profit margin from the Natale/Lenten dinners was, according to Alex, relatively low in relation to the number of hours expended by relatively few parishioners. The parish could benefit from other fundraising vehicles;
- (vi) on the expense side of the income statement, Alex reminded the council that Fr. Jhonnatan’s salary and benefits each year are supplied by the diocese in our budget planning workbook;
- (vii) on the expense side, Alex noted that the music director’s salary was running over budget making it desirable to reclassify the \$7,000 in the Music/Choir restricted fund to operating funds to cover this item and to budget more realistically for next FY with regard to this item;<sup>2</sup> and

On motion made and seconded, the council unanimously approved this reclassification.

- (vi) finally on the expense side, the \$9,000 recorded for the eight-month period (compared to the \$10,000 budgeted for the whole FY) suggests a need to improve controls with Gerardo for routine such services, with whom Alex undertook to negotiate. It also suggests a higher budget amount for FY25-26.

Alex summed up this part of the discussion by pointing to net surplus of \$17,000 as compared to a budgeted \$7,000 deficit as indicating that the parish is “in remarkably good financial shape.”

Alex then solicited ideas for fund raising possibly in place of the low margin-high effort Natale and Lenten dinners. Ideas ranged from bingo (Jim) to box lunches/dinners (AB), with council members promising to come forward with additional ideas in time for the next meeting which will be focused on a preliminary budget for next FY.

Fr. Jhonnatan and Alex then reminded the council that something should be done with the vacant lot adjacent to the parish grounds, if only to put an end to the annual weed clearing and property

tax obligations. After substantial discussion, the council authorized Alex to commit up to \$10,000 for written legal advice regarding the water rights a prospective purchaser of the property would receive, as a helpful first step to listing, possibly, the property for sale.

Fr. Jhonnatan then informed the council that he has been working on a project to create a new back altar for the sanctuary of the parish church; that he had already taken delivery of a new crucifix from an Ecuadorean artist that would be paired with the existing statues of Mary and Joseph after they had been retouched and colorized; that he had preliminary sketches and an estimate (\$45K - \$50K) for the project from two potentials wood-working companies; and that a parishioner was interested in underwriting this project in honor of his late father. The council authorized Fr. Jhonnatan to proceed with this project, it being the sense of the meeting that, while it would be ideal for the donor to absorb the full cost, the difference between his undertaking and the cost to complete could be bridged by a portion of the excess from this year’s AMA appeal raise.<sup>3</sup>

Attendees agreed that their next meeting would take place on Wednesday, July 23, 2025, at 3:00 PM.

Then, after Fr. Jhonnatan led the council in the Lord’s Prayer, Alex thanked the attendees for their time and entertained a motion to adjourn the meeting.

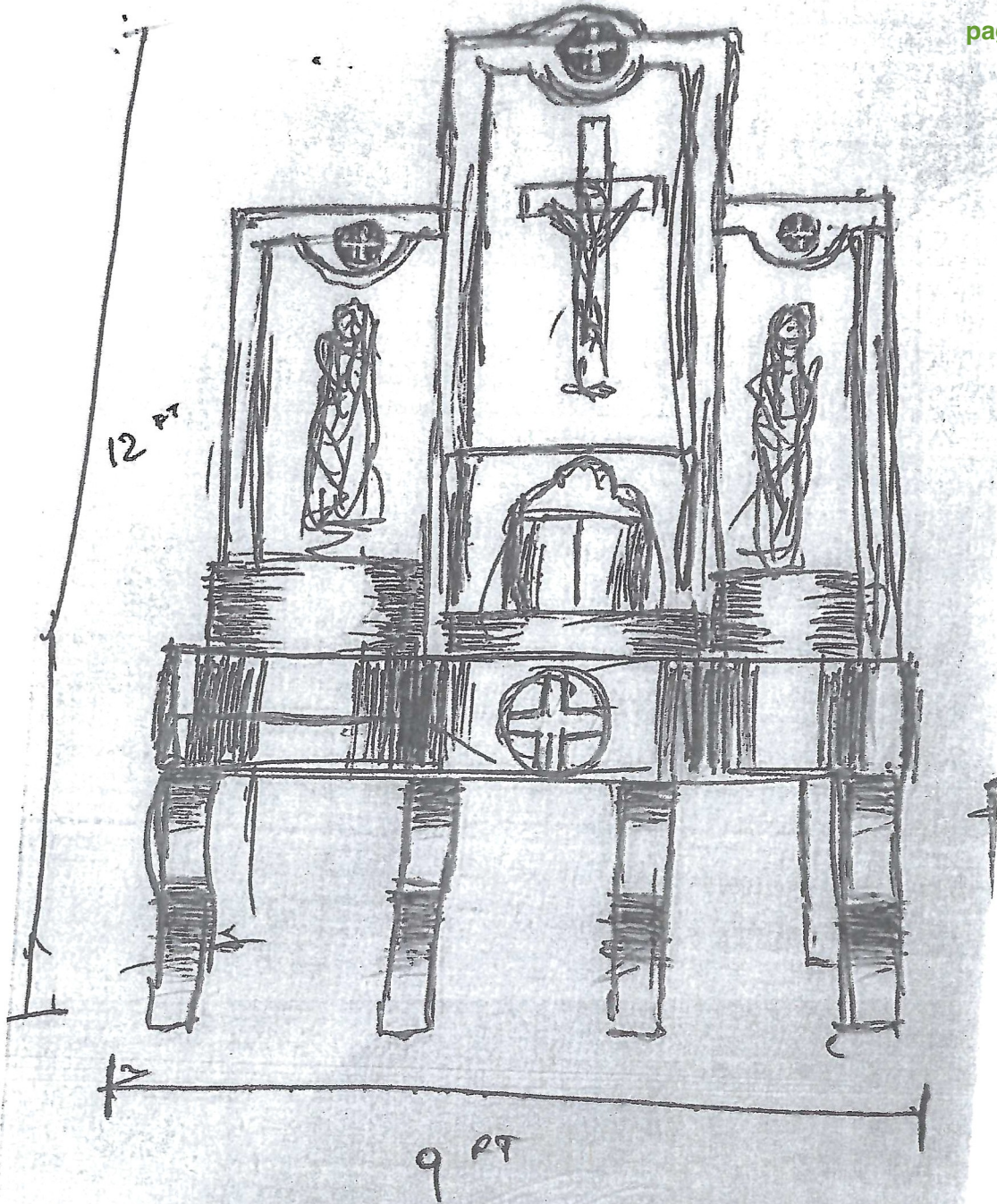

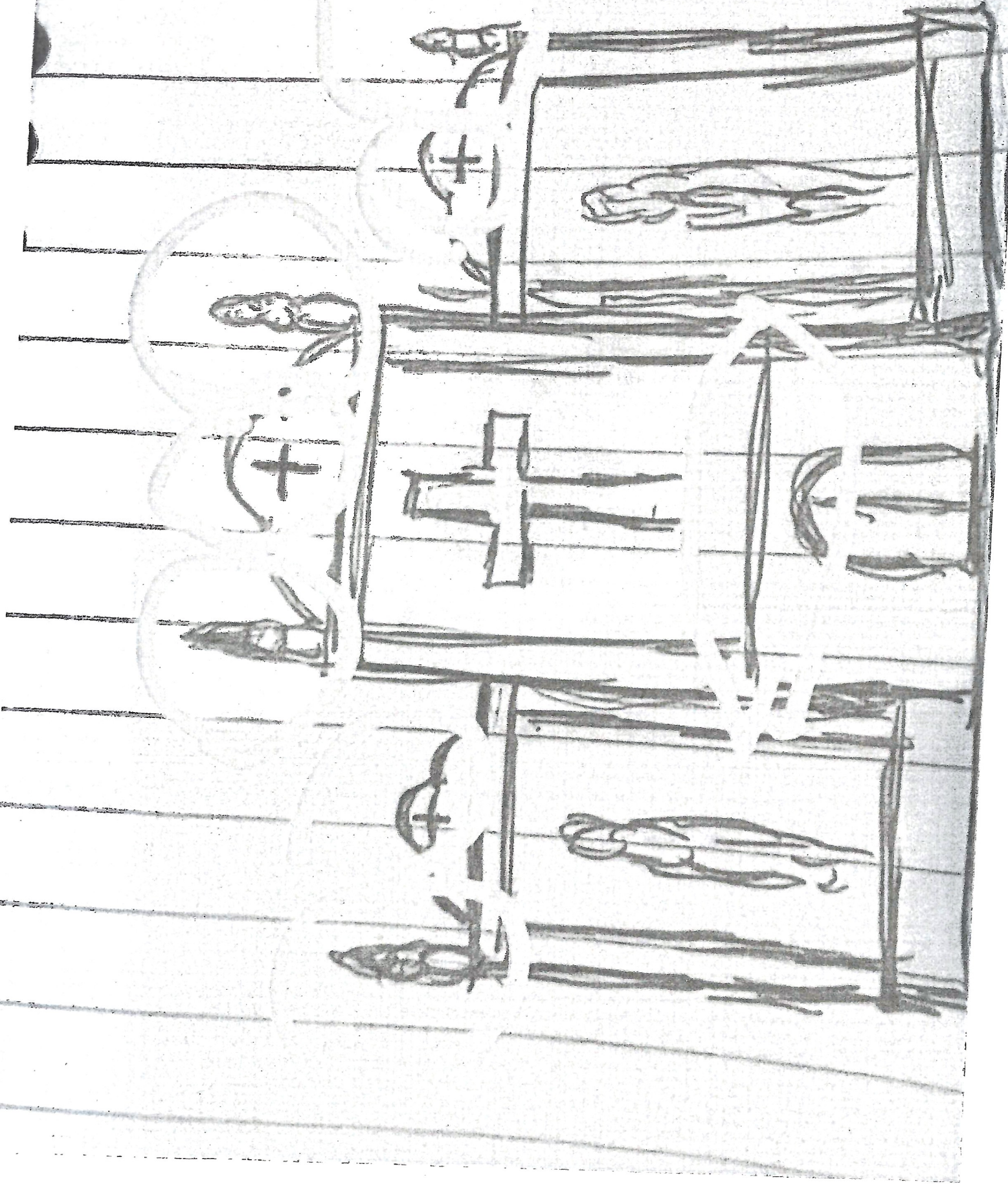

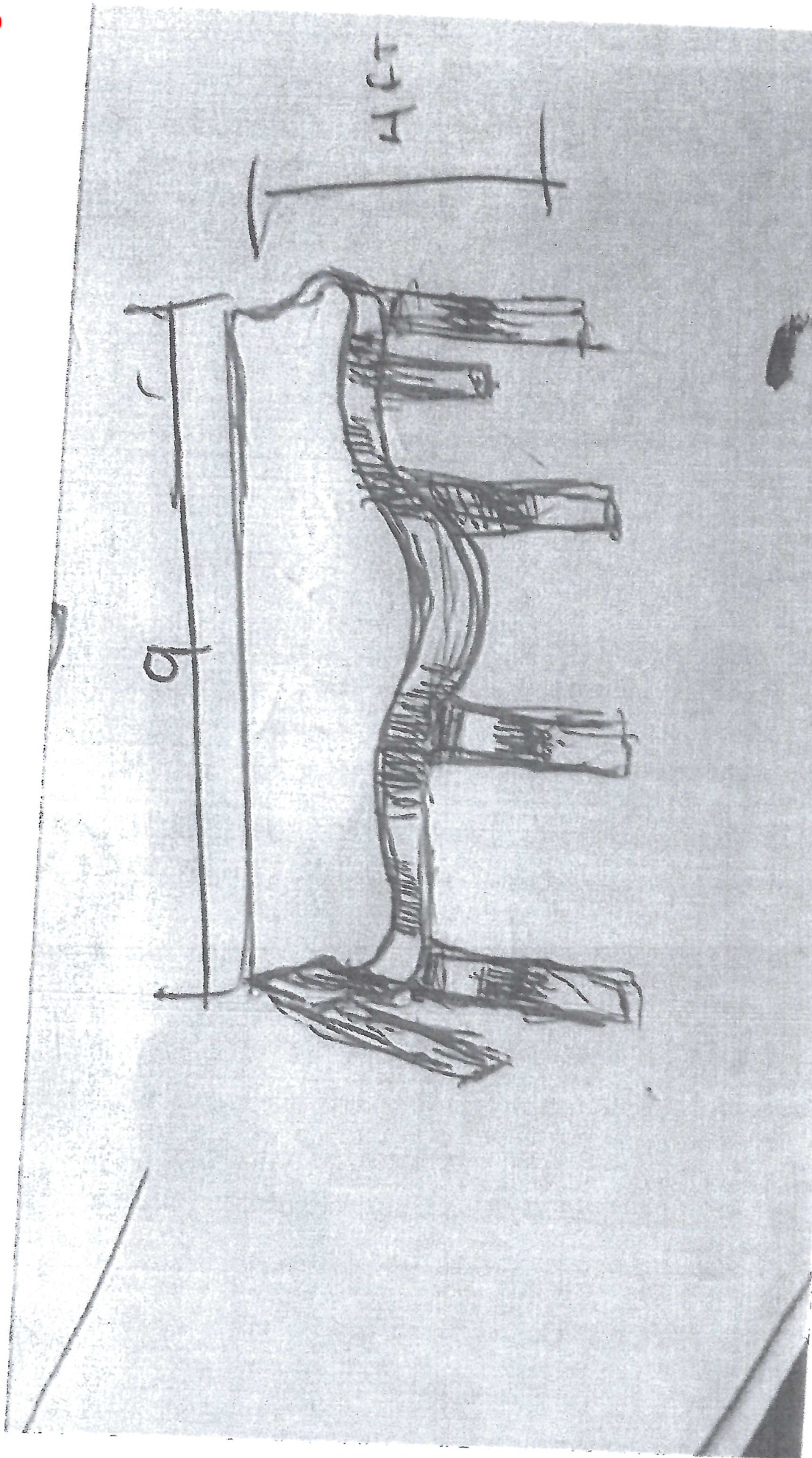
